
In 2020, Po Yew was appointed to the panel for the legal representation on consumer protection cases by the Competition and Consumer Commission of Singapore (CCCS).

- DyStar Global Holdings (Singapore) Pte Ltd v Kiri Industries Ltd & Ors and another suit [2018] SGHC(I) 06 — Successfully represented a global dyestuff and chemical manufacturer in bringing anticompetitive and contractual claims against a shareholder before the Singapore International Commercial Court.
- United Overseas Bank Ltd v Lippo Marina Collection Pte Ltd and others [2017] SGHC 1 Argued a novel case on litigation privilege which eventually went up to the Court of Appeal.
- Acted for Thai vendors of a Cambodian casino in an international SIAC arbitration involving a claim in excess of US\$250 million. The dispute relates to the sale of a casino to an Australian ASX listed company and inter alia involves claims for breaches of non-compete obligations.
- Successfully assisted to obtain a World-Wide Freezing Injunction against an ex-employee of a major logistics service provider who was suspected of fraud resulting in a full and complete recovery of all monies.
